



Diamond Pro Infield Mix and Red Infield Conditioner utilized on fields at City of San Angelo's Texas Bank Sports Complex and Rio Concho Community Park

In 2004, citizens of San Angelo, Texas voted for a one-half cent sales tax increase to fund improvements to parks and sports fields in the area; Texas Bank Sports Complex is a direct result of this election. Construction of the 80-acre park, which includes 11 softball fields, 1 baseball field, 2 little league fields, 1 tee ball field, 4 sand volleyball courts and a community playground, started in September 2007. Completed in the spring of 2009, the park was awarded Complex of the Year in 2012 by the **Texas Turfgrass Association**.

Diamond Pro provided 5,600 cubic yards of Infield Mix consisting of 60% sand, 20% silt and 20% clay. The material was tested at the plant and again at the site, for quality and consistency. The mix was incorporated with 240 tons of **Diamond Pro Red Infield Conditioner** and then used as a top dressing for the new infields. Parks Superintendent Roger Havlak said, "We used the Diamond Pro Infield Conditioner in the construction of 14 fields in 2009. Our staff is very pleased with its consistency, color retention, and how it aids with moisture management. It is a quality product which features many valuable attributes for infield maintenance. Our spectators and players love the looks of the fields and the overall playability."

The complex is used throughout the year for youth leagues, tournaments, softball and little leagues, and flag football. All fields have an irrigation and lighting system. Texas Bank Sports Complex is indeed a jewel for the City of San Angelo.
